- ★ The Sundance Film Festival, held in Park City each January, is considered the premier U.S. showcase for American and international independent film.
- ★ The Utah Shakespearean Festival is Tony Award-winning, named "America's Outstanding Regional Theatre" in 2000.
- ★ Glenn Dicterow, Concertmaster of the NY Philharmonic, has described Park City and the International Music Festival as one of the most "magical" spots on Earth for chamber music.
- ★ The Utah Arts Festival has attracted more than two million people, 4,500 performances and 3,600 artist's displays for over 30 years running!
