Day One – Salt Lake City East High School

Backdrop for HSM 1, 2 and 3 scenes

"The High School Musical" (HSM) itinerary begins at Salt Lake City's East High School, the backdrop for scenes from each of the films. Visitors can explore both the exterior and interior of the school, stopping along the way at Troy, Gabriella and Sharpay's lockers, as well as where the celebrated songs "What Time is It" and "I Want It All" were filmed. Complimentary tours are offered after 2 p.m. MST during weekdays, and maps illustrating the filming locations, t-shirts, sweatshirts and other High School Musical memorabilia are also available for purchase.
